The COHI West Texas Region is planning a regional training via Zoom beginning Saturday, August 19 and continuing weekly until the first week of December. This is a unique opportunity for existing centers to invite folks who may be interested in becoming a Lay Chaplain/Lay Pastoral Caregiver to participate in the training and the local center will not have to facilitate or find faculty for the 14 week training! Planning is well underway, although we have some fine-tuning to complete.



The host Zoom site is St George Episcopal Church in San Antonio. We envision that local folks would gather together at St. George to participate in the Zoom so that the bonds of friendship and community at the local center may grow along with developing these bonds with others in the region virtually. Terrific faculty have been confirmed for each module and Pam Piedfort and Tricia Jones will co-facilitate the sessions. Each West Texas Regional center will be responsible for ensuring each participant completes the participant application process and is provided with the participant training manual and a copy of the book The Rule of Benedict: A Spirituality for the 21st Century by Joan Chittister.

Hospice Chaplain Edwin Sasek had a vision of a place where persons slipping into their next life could spend their last days, or hours, in a calm, contemplative atmosphere and not in a hospital or a nursing home. After years of praying and planning, Edwin and his wife Patsy brought ABODE to life in San Antonio, TX. Because the past couple of years have been so brutal for St. George due to the deaths of many beloved friends and family members, our COHI center brought Edwin and Executive Director Mary Thorsby in to discuss grief, last days of life, and support services they provide for those in grief.

As a hospice chaplain, and with Patsy in her work as a volunteer coordinator, we had seen how needed and valued such a home would provide, and friends, colleagues, and family joined in the effort. Through the generosity of many, ABODE opened without a mortgage."
