



COHI Groups Mourn Loss of Lay Chaplain Susan Hiller KAREN HUBER-REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SOUTH REGION

Susan Sudduth Dodson Hiller, age 79, ended her battle with brain cancer at dusk on September 1, 2023. Susan was trained as a lay chaplain at St. James United Methodist Church and used her training to be the leader of the pastoral care program at St. Margaret's Episcopal Church as well as extensive bereavement and hospice care volunteering. Karen Huber comments, "She was also on the COHI regional council to help plan retreats. She was secretary up until January of this year when she was diagnosed with inoperable glial blastoma. That job has fallen to me, but for my friend Susan I will do it!"



After she lost her first husband in 1980, she joined a grief support group for young widows where she met and became friends with Anise (Ann) Baskette, another beloved COHI lay chaplain. Together these young widows became successful entrepreneurs when life threw them curve balls, starting a company that eventually became Medical Office Management Systems, Inc. ("MOMS") which was later acquired by WebMD. For their success with their company that provided computer infrastructure to medical offices they were recognized in 1998 as Small Business of the Year for the state. After retiring from business, Susan returned to grief counseling and hospice work and developed superb skills in this difficult discipline. She completed Community of Hope training at St. James United Methodist Church and then co-led many classes teaching others. She also worked for a number of years with Baptist Hospice, and also Arkansas Hospice with which she served on the board for a number of years. She made hundreds of visits to hospice patients. As a continuation of her love for bereavement counseling she became heavily involved in her lay pastoral role as leader of the pastoral care program at St. Margaret's Episcopal Church.

I said, "I'm confused." You asked about my devotions.

Understanding Changes in our Annual Reporting

Change is hard! I know, I get it! For the last few years, Community of Hope has been in a significant state of transformation. Beginning with the COVID-19 pandemic, then changes in leadership, both on the Board of Directors as well as Regional Reps, and a robust organizational redevelopment project, we have been in a stage of intentional "disruption", as our coach refers to it. While our structure continues to change, policy and procedure changes will follow.

Since 2020, we have dropped counting the number of hours spent as a metric in our annual reporting and this year we are expanding our understanding of how/where caregiving is done. We want to include a count (or estimate) of simple pastoral encounters in addition to scheduled pastoral visits because we recognize that we are "serving others through compassionate listening" in many more ways than we previously focused on.



In 2020, because we were unable to do much, if any, pastoral visits, we began to ask for a narrative on the overall health of the center. The information has been so helpful to know how the centers have been doing, and the variety of ways they are serving, we have continued to ask for that as part of the annual report.

The board has decided to permanently change the report to follow the calendar year, extending the current due date for 2023 reports to January 1. 2024. The Leadership Team Guidelines will be updated with this information.

Here is what we need from each center:

- 1. Number of Active Lay Chaplains.
- 2. Number of Pastoral Encounters/Visits.
- 3. How often the center is conducting Circle of Care.
- 4. When the last training was offered/if there is a plan to offer training.

In addition to these four points, a brief narrative that speaks to the overall well-being of each center including any struggles, and what kinds of caregiving the members are doing.

I hope that this helps you, not only in understanding the changes to the reporting process, but in why we are moving in the direction that we are. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
